I wrote to you yesterday, thrilled to report that our first day of remote learning went better than anyone could have imagined. A number of our families wrote me back and echoed the same sentiments. Everyone has been phenomenal. Our teachers and support staff have been conducting quality lessons under the most difficult of situations. Our administration has organized our buildings and district to take some of the stress off of our faculty and families by creating procedures and a plan to conduct business. Food service and transportation has been preparing breakfast and lunch for students who would like it and we have been delivering meals to families unable to get to a school. Special education and Child Study Teams have been conducting meetings and developing accommodations to help students wherever possible. Secretaries, aides, nurses and many others are performing their regular responsibilities while also adapting to new tasks that did not exist prior to this week. Our custodians and maintenance workers are keeping our buildings especially clean and getting a head start on some projects that could not be done if we had students in the schools.

As we enter this temporary new world order, our students and their parents and guardians have really stepped up to the plate. We know many of you are facilitating our instruction at home, especially with our youngest students. Our curriculum department has developed some additional strategies, in this newsletter, that you can do with your children, both educationally and to help replace all of the extra activities that have been cancelled.

Much of the following newsletter was written before we ever considered shutting our doors and going to a remote learning model. However, the purpose of this newsletter is to highlight some of the great things that have happened recently in our schools. 
