The Board reelected Eileen Francisco-Cabus as the President and Sal Schiano as the Vice President.

During the month of January, we have had professional development for all of our staff, celebrated Martin Luther King, Jr. and managed to make it through the month without any weather emergencies! In fact, during this first week of February, we are seeing temperatures in the sixties. However, we all know that will not last. In fact, looking back at previous years, many of our closings have occurred in February, March, and even an occasional April.

In February, our staff and students will celebrate President's Day and we begin our second semester. Behind the scenes, the administration has been busy preparing the school budget for next year. Toward the end of March, the Board of Education will need to approve a tentative budget for the 2020-21 academic year and have it submitted to the county for review. This budget will be designed to meet our academic and financial obligations while attempting to improve the school district. The final budget will not be approved until April, but this first draft of the budget will be a good predictor of the finances of the school district moving forward.

BRSD Staff Views Security Drill

The BRSD is always striving to maintain and improve safety in our schools. At a recent staff professional development day, the District partnered with the Bordentown Twp. Police Department to practice an *active shooter drill* while the students were out of the building. Staff members volunteered to participate or acted as spectators. Four Bordentown Township Police officers, including school resource officer Adam Edwards, emerged from the stairwell, in formation, and moved quickly and carefully down the back hallway of our high school to simulate a class by class evacuation.

Prior to the announced drill, Chief Brian Pesce addressed all district staff members to inform them of the various elements of the drill and the precautions taken by the participating officers to ensure the safety of officers, participants, and spectators during the drill. Following, Chief Pesce and Officer Edwards fielded questions from staff members and reiterated the processes to follow in the event of an actual emergency. Throughout the question and answer period, Chief Pesce discussed the readiness of the police departments in both Bordentown Township and Bordentown City to respond to such an event and emphasized the importance of collaboration in keeping district schools safe.



The district extends our gratitude to Chief Pesce and all of the officers involved in the drill and continues to value the strong relationship that exists between the police and school district in an effort to ensure the safety of all of Bordentown's schools.

Achieving Excellence through Equity

In addition to viewing the drill, BRSD staff members also had the opportunity to learn from colleagues who had attended a three-session workshop focused on equity and cultural proficiency as part of the district's membership in the New Jersey Consortium for Excellence through Equity (NJCEE), an interdistrict learning community focused on ensuring the success of all students. Five district staff members, (Mr. Riether, MIS Principal; Ms. Patterson, BRMS Guidance Counselor; Ms. Rossell, PMS teacher; Ms. Morley, BRHS Assistant Principal; and Mr. Gens, Language Arts Supervisor) introduced the group to the ideas of the "single story" and "implicit bias", the concept of cultural proficiency, and the ways in which BRSD is working to create an inclusive environment.
